Ray Conway Lee, son of Ray Taylor and Edith Susetta Mayberry Lee, was born October 18, 1934 in Turner, Missouri. He departed this life Saturday, August 17, 2013 in the Heart of the Ozarks Care Center, Ava, Missouri, at the age of seventy-eight years, nine months, and thirty days.

On June 26, 1957, Ray was united in marriage to Leah Mae VanNess and to this union two daughters were born.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Junior Lee, who passed in infancy, and Roy Lee.

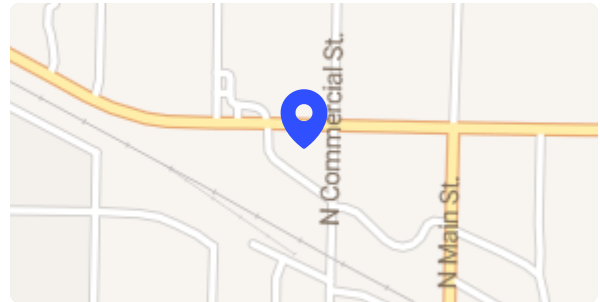
