She crossed over, Sunday, June 1, 2014, in Christian Health Care and Rehabilitation of Lebanon South, Lebanon, Missouri at the age of seventy-nine years, four months and five days.

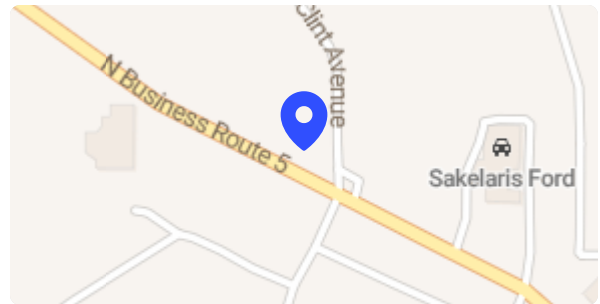

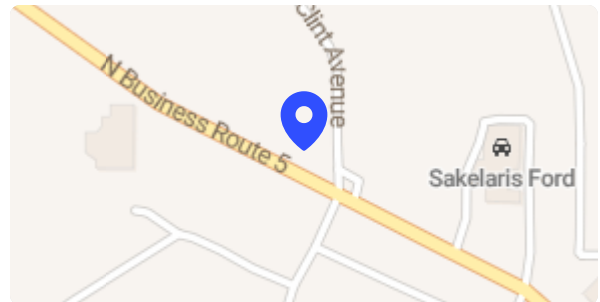

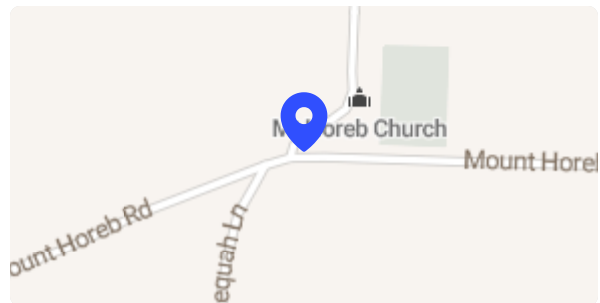
