Pearl Rachel Blackmore, daughter of John William and Julia Ann Eckhart McIntyre, was born July 8, 1915, in Normal, Illinois. She departed this life Monday, April 18, 2011, in Ozark Rehabilitation and Health Care Center, Osage Beach, Missouri, at the age of ninety-five years, nine months and ten days. On June 11, 1966, in Urbana, Missouri, she was united in marriage to James Earl Blackmore. Together they shared twenty-four years of marriage before his passing in January of 1991.
