**C**hristine Evelyn Nofziger, daughter of James William and Myrtle Dell Isbell Kay, was born September 17, 1912, in Watsonville, California. She departed this life Wednesday, April 13, 2011, in Mountains Community Hospital, in Lake Arrowhead, California, at the age of ninety-eight years, seven months, and six days. On May 22, 1937, she was united in marriage to Robert Alfred Nofziger, and to this union one daughter was born. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Robert, on January 9, 1996; a daughter, Roberta Scholz; and a sister, Lorraine. Christine is survived by two grandsons, Robert Scholz, of Lake Arrowhead, California, and Richard Scholz, of Anthem, Arizona; as well as a host of other relatives and friends.
