## Farmer Myers

JUN 18, 1919 - MAR 19, 2011

**F**armer Quentin Myers, son of John and Laura Hill Myers, was born June 18, 1919, near Abo, Missouri. He departed this life Saturday, March 19, 2011, in his home, near Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of ninety-one years, nine months, and one day. On July 10, 1954, he was united in marriage to Edna L. Reid, and to this union two sons were born. He was preceded in death by his parents; six brothers, Luther, Kirby, Ellis "Dink", Howard, Ivan, and Willis Myers; and two sisters, Alta Reid, and Artie Elam.
