**R**onald Lynn Moore, son of Lee W. and Mary O. Clark Moore, was born December 9, 1939 near Lebanon in Laclede County, Missouri. He departed this life Sunday, December 5, 2010 in St. Louis, Missouri at the age of seventy-three years, eleven months, and twenty-six days.
