Susan Earnestine “Tina” Hensley, daughter of Matthew and Inez Woods Carpenter, was born December 9, 1923, in Northview, Missouri. She departed this life Monday, October 20, 2008, at Cox Medical Center South in Springfield, Missouri, at the age of eighty-four years, ten months, and eleven days. In November of 1941, Tina was united in marriage to Cleo Cook who preceded her in death on January 3, 1977. On July 4, 1978, she was married to Weaver Hensley and together they shared nearly six years until his passing in March of 1984. Tina was also preceded in death by her parents; a son, Chuck, in November of 1986; a nephew, Larry Carpenter, who was like a son to her; two sisters, Gladys and Betty; and five brothers, Henry, Ed, Glen, Lynn, and Lee.
