Gareld LeRoy Lerdahl, son of Orin L. and Olive V. Bartholomew Lerdahl, was born February 27, 1941, in Wauzeka, Wisconsin. He departed this life Saturday, August 6, 2016, in the Harry S. Truman Veterans Hospital, in Columbia, Missouri, at the age of seventy-five years, five months, and eleven days.

On March 17, 1961, he was united in marriage to Francis Catherine Allen, and to this union one daughter and two sons were born.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and a brother, Bernard Lerdahl.

The family then lived in St. Robert, Missouri for about fifteen years, before moving to Lebanon for the last fifteen years. Jerry was a gifted carpenter and electrician and worked as an independent electrician for many years.

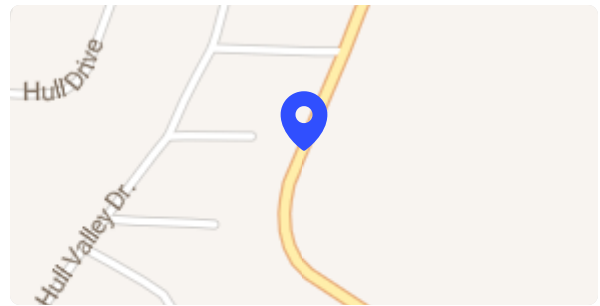

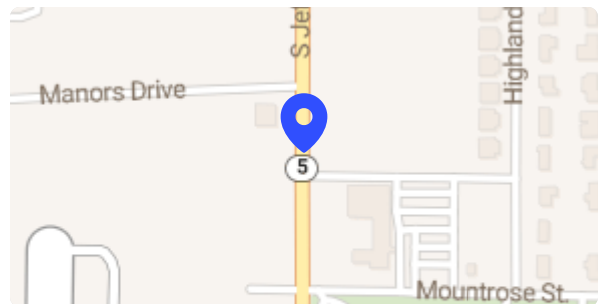

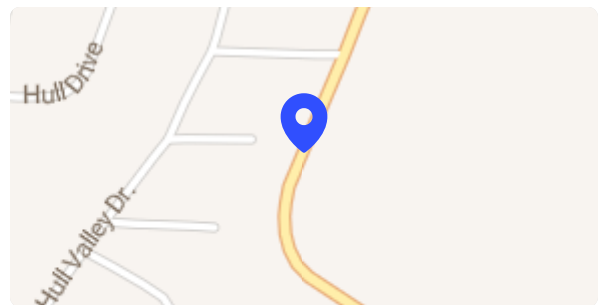
