**C**harles Lee Holt, son of Schuyler C. and Mary Roseann Browning Holt, was born June 2, 1933, in Princeton, Missouri. He departed this life Friday, January 13, 2017, in Mercy Hospital, in Springfield, Missouri, at the age of eighty-three years, seven months, and eleven days.

On February 27, 1955, he was united in marriage to Janice Ilene Haynes, and to this union two daughters and two sons were born.

He was preceded in death by his parents; four brothers, Herman, Earl D., Lloyd, and Calvin; and a sister, Velma.

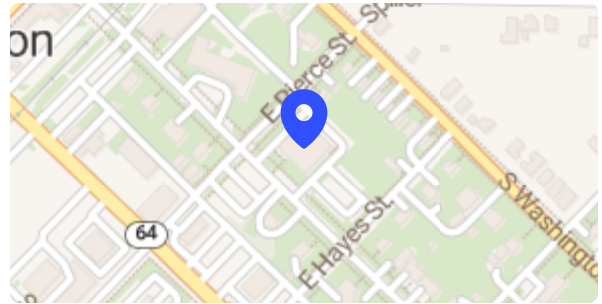

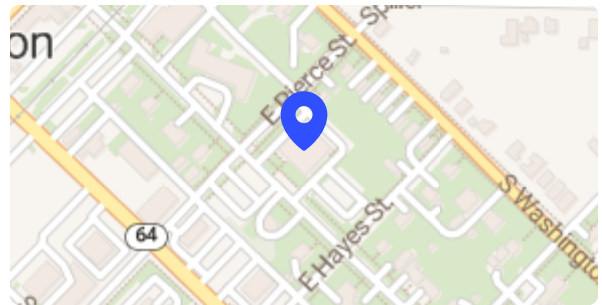

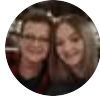
