Kenneth Henry, 92, Lebanon, MO, formerly of Malvern, Arkansas, died Friday, September 14, 2018, in Lebanon South Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. He was preceded in death by his parents, R.F. and Mable Henry; and his wife, Martha “Marty” Henry.
