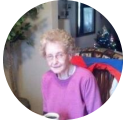
Arkansas; many nieces, nephews, and caring friends.

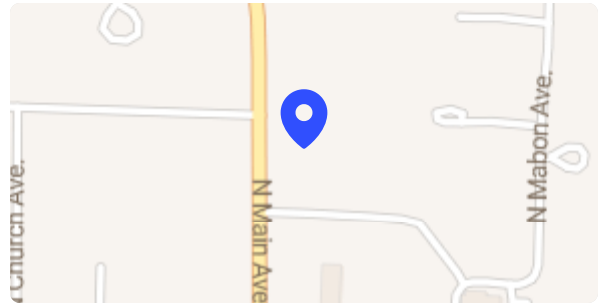

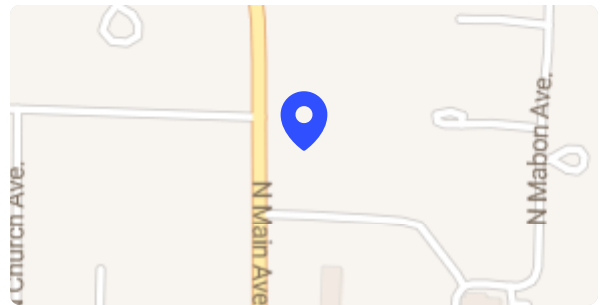

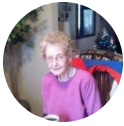
