Arrangements are under the direction of Allee-Holman-Howe Funeral Home, Camdenton, Missouri.



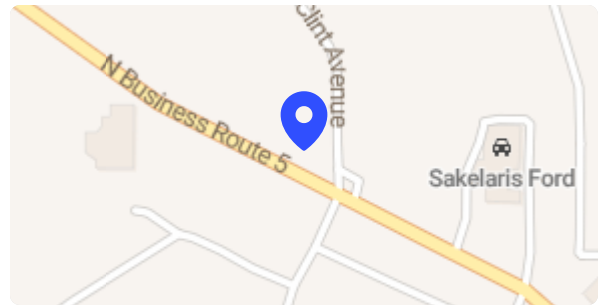

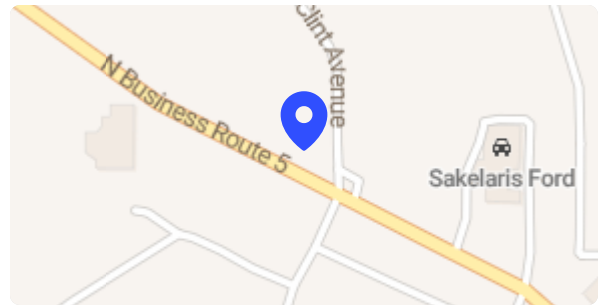
