**C**assy, William Ray Bill, 58 William Ray Cassy, son of Arthur Ray and Emma Louise LaFollette Cassy, was born October 5, 1947, in Walnut Shade, Missouri. He departed this life Saturday, January 28, 2006, in his home, in Ava, Missouri, at the age of fifty-eight years, three months, and twenty-three days. On October 8, 1976, he was united in marriage to Jean Marie Brown, and together they shared the last twenty-nine years. He was preceded in death by his parents; his fourteen-year-old son, Christopher Lloyd Cassy in 1992; and a sister, Aleta Sue Langston.
