Trent, Aileen LaRue Sally, 77 Aileen LaRue Trent, daughter of Eldridge Yeary and Lottie Foster Fields, was born July 19, 1928, in Alex, Oklahoma. She departed this life Friday, January 27, 2006, in St. John's Hospital, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of seventy-seven years, six months, and eight days.
