He departed this life Monday, December 17, 2007, in St. John's Regional Health Center, Springfield, at the age of seventy-three years, four months and nine days. On March 25, 1960, he was united in marriage to Helen Kay Hurley, and to this union three children were born. He was preceded in death by his father and a brother, Jack Robertson. In 1963 he and Kay purchased the farm, running the dairy operation for thirty-five

years. Due to ill health they have made their home in Mountain Grove for the last seven years. Billie professed his faith in Christ, and was saved in 1962. He is a member of the Friendship Baptist Church, where he served as a deacon and former choir and song leader. He also enjoyed fishing in his spare time, especially gigging. Billie was a loving husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, son, brother and uncle, and was a caring neighbor and friend.
