Floyd Everett Butler, son of Edward and Emma Barnett Butler, was born November 1, 1920, near Sleeper, Missouri. He departed this life Friday, August 15, 2008, in his home, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of eighty-seven years, nine months, and fourteen days. On July 3, 1938, he was united in marriage to Eva Hazel Morgan, and together they shared fifty-two years before her passing on December 1, 1990. He was united in marriage to Lois A. Watkins Atchley on December 10, 1991, and she passed away on September 9, 1998. On May 14, 1999, he was united in marriage to Doris V. Mason McClung, who preceded him in death on October 8, 2006. He was also preceded in death by his parents; a brother, Jack Butler; and two sisters, Nathaline Franks, and Mary Jane Dallas.
