Lucille Bond Johnson, daughter of George W. and Chloe E. Simpson Bond, was born September 17, 1927, near Competition, Missouri. She departed this life Friday, June 22, 2012, in Christian Health Care South, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of eighty-four years, nine months, and five days.

On May 15, 1948, she was united in marriage to Thomas Darwin Johnson, and to this union one daughter was born.

She was preceded in death by her parents; and her husband, Darwin, of June 19, 1989. Lucille is survived by a daughter, JoNel Cisco, and her husband, Jim, of St. Robert Missouri; two grandchildren T. J. Sapko, III, and Payton Chloe Sapko; several cousins; as well as a host of other relatives and friends.

She was born and raised in the Competition community, and graduated from Competition High School. She taught school for a few years at the Delto and Gardner Schools. In her spare time she enjoyed working in her garden and growing beautiful flowers. She also helped care for her mother for several years. She loved her family dearly and especially enjoyed spending time with her daughter and grandchildren.
