Marion Robert Napier, son of Robert Lincoln and Johanna (Hosiner) Napier was born July 17, 1934 near Seymour, Missouri. He departed this life Friday, November 6, 2009 in Lexington Square in Keokuk, Iowa, at the age of seventy-five years, three months, and twenty days. He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers-in-law, Lloyd Johnson and Marion Ellis; and two nephews, Leland Johnson and David Asher.
