## **Ralph Neasby (Lebanon)**

**R**alph Lee Neasby, son of Arvil and Grace Coonce Neasby, was born November 20, 1927, near Phillipsburg, Missouri. He departed this life Wednesday, October 5, 2011, in the Missouri Veterans Home in Mount Vernon, Missouri, at the age of eighty-three years, ten months, and fifteen days.

On October 5, 1951, he was united in marriage to Wilma Faye Hightower, and to this union one daughter and two sons were born.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Ray and Don Neasby; and three sisters, Leitha Moore, Pauline Sharp, and Faith Holiday.
