## **Kermit (Buster) Pruitt**

**K**ermit “Buster” Pruitt, son of Kermit Leo and Ferba Arther Pruitt, was born July 10, 1946, in Los Angeles, California. He departed this life Tuesday, May 8, 2007, in St. John’s Hospital, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of sixty years, nine months, and twenty-eight days.
