Virginia Fay Stigall, daughter of John Henry Page and Virginia Alice Ward, was born January 31, 1939, in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan. She departed this life Saturday, October 30, 2010, in Texas County Memorial Hospital, in Houston, Missouri, at the age of seventy-one years, eight months and twenty-nine days.

On November 3, 1955, she was united in marriage to Randall Paul (Dempsy) Stigall, who preceded her in death on August 28, 1994.
