**P**aul Charles Taylor, son of Charles and Marian Crow Taylor, was born May 7, 1939, near Lebanon, Missouri. He departed this life Friday, March 14, 2008, in his home, near Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of sixty-eight years, ten months, and seven days. On July 13, 1957, he was united in marriage to Marolyn I. Thomas, and to this union three daughters were born. He was preceded in death by his parents; and a sister, Janet Dampier.
