**M**illard West, son of John Henry and Mary Matilda Webster West, was born September 3, 1904, near Stoutland, Missouri. He departed this life Wednesday, April 4, 2007, in Christian Health Care South, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of one hundred two years, seven months, and one day. Early in his life he was united in marriage to Ruby Selby, who preceded him in death in August of 1979. On July 18, 1981, he married Dorcas Louise Jones Copley and together they shared the last twenty-five years. He was also preceded in death by his parents; a daughter, Willene Disch; a great-grandson, Isaiah Disch; three brothers, Leonard, Neely, and Dola West; and a sister, Clara Murphy. Millard was a loving husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and uncle, and was a caring neighbor and friend.
