Roseanne Macris, daughter of Harry and Margaret Steele Hines, was born September 26, 1943, in Alameda, California. She departed this life Tuesday, June 23, 2020, in Mercy Hospital, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of seventy-six years, eight months, and twenty-eight days.

On May 1, 1965, she was united in marriage to Randolph Macris and to this union one daughter was born.

She was preceded in death by her parents; and her husband, Randolph, in 2010.

Roseanne is survived by a daughter, Maureen Jacobs, and her husband, John, of Lebanon, Missouri; a granddaughter, Veronica Jacobs, of Lebanon, Missouri; as well as a host of other relatives and friends.

She was raised in Richmond, Missouri, and graduated from Richmond High School. 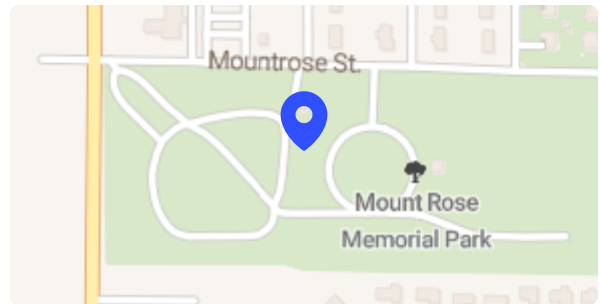
