**M**ichael Jackson Nutter, son of Jackson C. and Jewel Moore Nutter, was born December 7, 1953, in Lebanon, Missouri. He departed this life Wednesday, July 29, 2020, in Mercy Hospital, in Springfield, Missouri, at the age of sixty-six years, seven months, and twenty-two days.

On January 1, 2011, he was united in marriage to Kathy Marie Burris, and they shared the last nine years.

He was preceded in death by his father; and two sisters, Peggy Doyle and Rhonda Morris.

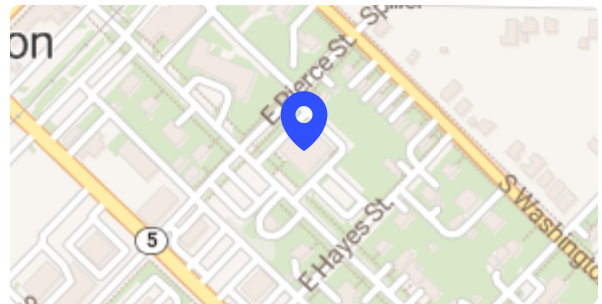

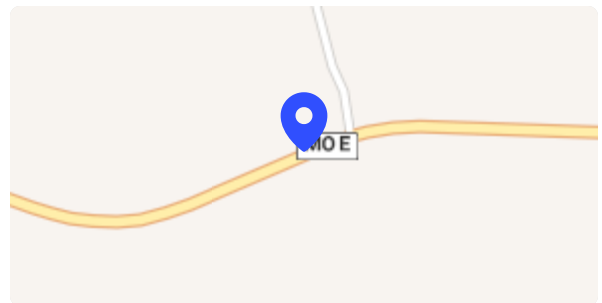

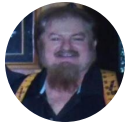
