Suddenly, a lightning bolt entered the room through an open window, crossed the room right in front of her, exited the room through another window, and hit the radio antenna on her car, blasting it off the car! Understandably, she was quite flustered and nervous for the rest of the day. Not that I can blame her. I just found out about her death today, 7/27/2021. Honestly, I didn't even know that she and Uncle Raymond had moved to Texas. (But I'm glad they did, and had assistance in their final years.)
