Richard Frederick Fiegenbaum, Jr., son of Richard Frederick Fiegenbaum, Sr. and Alvena Bandermann Fiegenbaum, was born November 19, 1947, in Higginsville, Missouri. He departed this life Saturday, January 23, 2021, in his home, near Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of seventy-three years, two months, and four days.

On June 29, 1969, he was united in marriage to Evelyn Lydia Maude Croka, and to this union three sons were born.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and his wife, Evelyn, on December 14, 2016. After he and Evelyn were married, they made their home in several different places and lovingly raised their sons. After retiring from the Army, the family moved to Plato, Missouri in 1993, and then to Lebanon in 2011. Richard was a civil service employee at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, where he worked as a mechanic at the Firestone Store for several years.

Richard had attended Sleeper United Methodist Church, near Lebanon for the last several years.

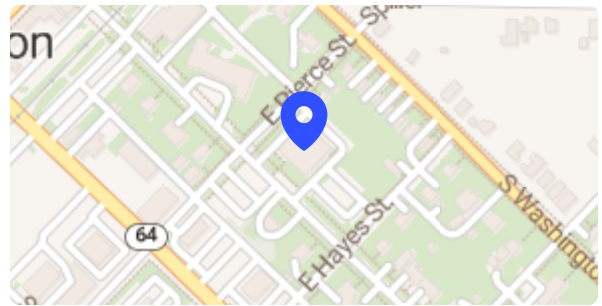

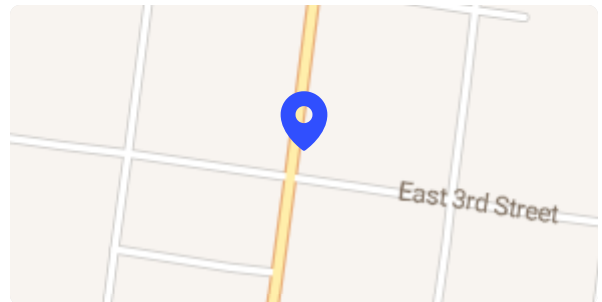

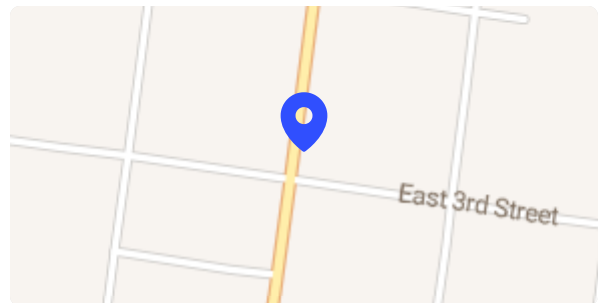
