**M**arjorie Lucille Hough, daughter of John Guy and Julia Luthy Appling, was born August 30, 1923, near Lebanon, Missouri. She entered her Heavenly home on Wednesday, February 3, 2021, in Cedarhurst Assisted Living Center, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of ninety-seven years, five months, and four days. On May 10, 1947, she was united in marriage to Dean Edward Hough and they shared forty-five wonderful years before his passing on August 25, 1992.

She was also preceded in death by her parents; two sisters, Eleanor DeBerry, and Virginia O'Quinn; her sister-in-law, June Appling; two nephews, Alan DeBerry and Kevin O'Quinn; and Dean's niece, Lea Ann Hough.
