**B**illy Clay Haskew, son of Clarence D. and Ollie Bell (McCasland) Haskew, was born November 5, 1932, in Portales, New Mexico. He departed this life Monday, May 17, 2010, in Hartville Care Center, in Hartville, Missouri, at the age of seventy-seven years, six months and twelve days.

On September 17, 1954, he was united in marriage to Cora Ann Huddleston, and they shared thirty-five years together.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Cora Ann, on November 7, 1989; a daughter, Cynthia Kay Haskew; and three brothers, Clayton and Joe Haskew, and an infant brother.
