**M**arvin "Dean" Young, son of Joe Albert and Anna Agnes Owens Young, was born November 30, 1940 in Seymour, Missouri. He departed this life Sunday, July 24, 2011 in Cox South Hospital, at the age of seventy years, seven months, and twenty-four days. He was preceded in death by his parents, son Marvin Dean Young, Jr. and a brother Don Young.
