**W**illiam "Bill" Henry Stahl, son of Guy and Catherine (Bigelow) Stahl, was born October 25, 1944, in Alma, Michigan. He departed this life Monday, August 15, 2022, in his home, near Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of seventy-seven years, nine months, and twenty days.

On February 7, 1970, he was united in marriage to Bonnie Ruth Blankenship, and to this union three daughters and one son were born.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two grandchildren, Sawyer Ryan Staver and Rebecca Emily Travis; four great-grandchildren, Robyn Grey Dugger, Andie Elizabeth Dugger, Reaven Lakai Schmitt, and Reece Peyton Schmitt.

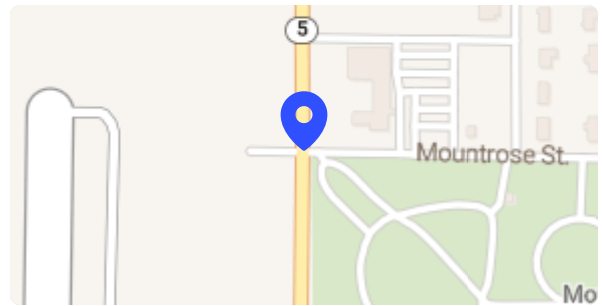

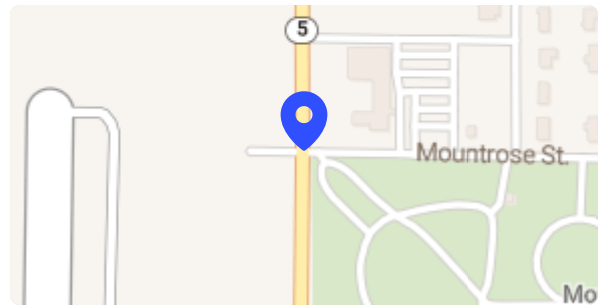
