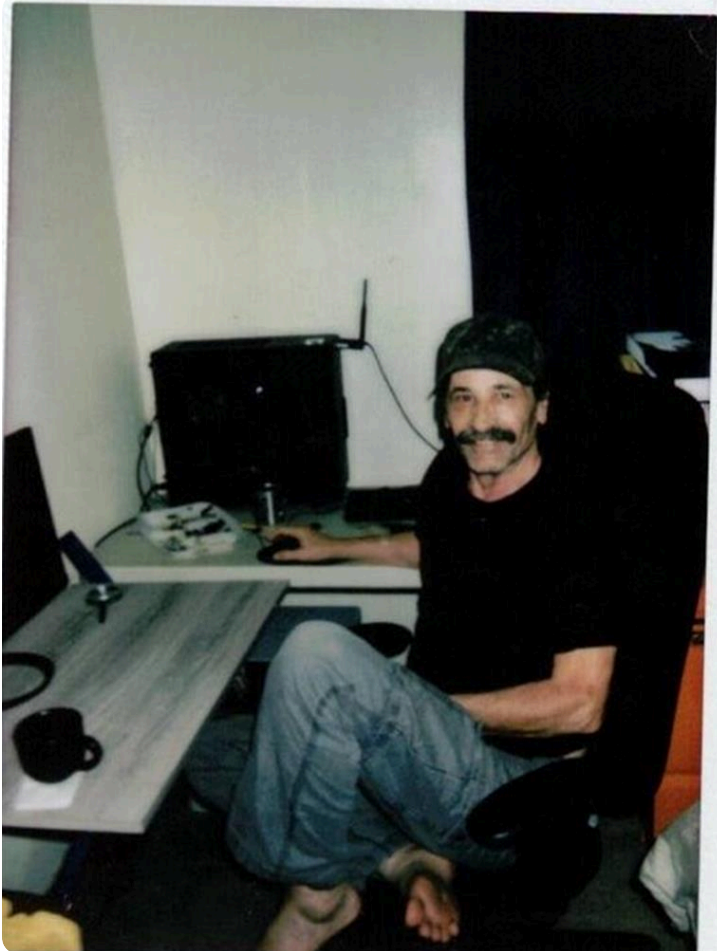

This was the last picture taken of my daddo. Sept 2, 2022 my bday only 4 day after his. He was 62.



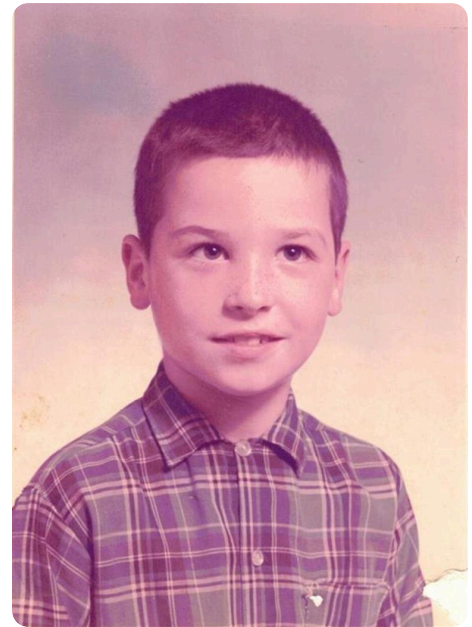

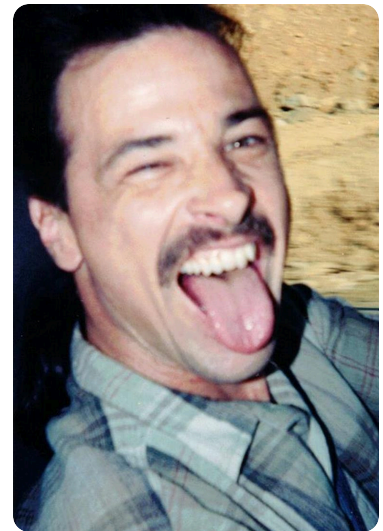
Bob & his twin brother Bill just under the age of 3. This was taken in July of 1963.
