MaryAnn Seymour was born July 29, 1944, in Greenville, Texas, to the late Charles L. Husbands and Doris E. Swan Husbands. She departed this life on Wednesday, May 1, 2024, at Cedarhurst Assisted Living in Lebanon, Missouri. At the time of her passing, she was seventy-nine years old.

She spent her early years in Texas and then moved with her family to Littleton, Colorado, in 1950. She completed her schooling in Colorado, earning her bachelor's degree from Colorado State University.

On June 4, 1966, MaryAnn was united in marriage to Robert Lynn Seymour, and they shared forty-nine wonderful years before his passing on July 5, 2015. Robert served in the U.S. Army, and MaryAnn was a proud Army wife.

She is survived by two sons, Scott Seymour and his wife Jackie of Lebanon, Missouri; Carl
