



## Arley "Bud" Yates (Lebanon)

March 1, 1944 - October 19, 2020

Arley Presley Yates, son of Arley M. and Audrey Hurd Yates, was born March 1, 1944, in Depew, Oklahoma. He departed this life Monday, October 19, 2020, in the University of Missouri Hospital, in Columbia, Missouri, at the age of seventy-six years, seven months, and eighteen days.

He liked being outdoors where his favorite activities were hunting and entertaining his grandchildren and great-grandchildren on his John Deere gator. His family was very important to him and he especially enjoyed his great-grandchildren.
