Mary Sue “Susie” Chalfant, daughter of David H. and Thelma King Chalfant, was born August 25, 1927, near Richland, Missouri. She departed this life Sunday, May 26, 2019, in Lebanon North Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, in Lebanon, Missouri, at the age of ninety-one years, nine months, and one day.

She even attended a NASCAR race with her son, Richard, while she was in her 80’s. Her family was very dear to her and she especially enjoyed spending time with her children and grandchildren.

Susie was a loving mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, sister, aunt, and was a caring neighbor and friend. We celebrate her life and know that her family and friends will cherish the wonderful memories she created for them during her ninety-one years.
