During his teaching career, he developed partnerships with General Motors and Chrysler through their donation programs to obtain training aids for his students. He was co-advisor of VICA and drove his students to contests. Continuing after

retirement, he served as the Competitive Events Chair at the Skills USA contests. He also drove a school bus for the Camdenton R-III School District and drove the same bus route for twenty-three years. During that time, he also drove the varsity basketball and football teams to countless away games. Wayne was an avid Laker Football fan and for many years he could be found standing on the sidelines cheering on the Lakers.

Wayne was active in his community and served as a charter member of the Camdenton Ambulance District for three years. He also served on the Camdenton R-III School Board for thirteen years. During his tenure he was instrumental in getting the bond issue passed for the new Camdenton High School, as well as the expansions at the Hurricane Deck and Osage Beach Elementary Schools.

Wayne was a loving husband, father, grandfather, and uncle, and was a caring neighbor and friend. We celebrate his long life and many accomplishments will cherish the wonderful memories he has created for his family and friends.
